
Earning of Bachelor's Degree within 6 years of initial enrollment

AVID and **U.S.** college enrollees' persistence rates from first Fall term to second Fall term




AVID students consistently persist into their second year of college at a higher rate than the U.S. overall rate.

AVID and **U.S.** college enrollees' persistence rates from first Fall term to second Fall term




AVID students from any/all backgrounds persist.

Six-Year Graduation Rate with a Bachelor's Degree

U.S. graduation rate from first institution attended for bachelor's degree-seeking students at a 4-year college



The achievement gap in bachelor's degree attainment is clearly evident, with a gap of 33 percentage points for U.S. college students earning a bachelor's degree.



AVID students slash the achievement gap in half (gap of 15 pts).


